Presenting a rectangular frame with intersecting corners, the mirror features a layered texture made of a series of overlapping notches showcasing raised diamonds and other geometric motifs adorning the four sides. The ensemble is accented with a regular rhythm of brass tacks. This frame boasts a brown patina and surrounds a clear mirror providing great reflection. With its nice proportions, skillfully hand-carved décor and brown patina, this French Tramp Art Folk mirror circa 1900 will make for a great addition to any home, particularly placed in a mountain cabin or country home, perhaps hung above a side table or buffet.
